Lösungsvorschlag

- a) *We must bring our pencil cases and exercise books to school every day.*

Lösung/Lösungsvorschlag

- a) *Caroline mentions seven rules. (not allowed to put bags and blazers on tables / not allowed to eat or drink / not allowed to chew gum / wear the correct school uniform / listen to teachers and do what they say / put our hands up if we want to say something / no swearwords)*
- b) *Caroline and her classmates are allowed to drink water.*
They are not allowed to put their bags and blazers on the tables, eat or drink, chew gum, wear regular clothes or use swearwords.
They must wear the correct school uniform, listen to the teachers and do what they tell them to do, and put their hands up if they want to say something.
They needn't wear ties. They needn't stay outside for more than two minutes if the teacher sends them outside to 'cool down'.
- c) *Caroline thinks that the rule about their bags and blazers is OK because the desks are small.*
She doesn't really understand why she is not allowed to chew gum because it helps her to concentrate.
She doesn't like the rule about school uniform because she doesn't really like the colour black or dark blue. She wishes she could wear regular clothes.
She thinks it's OK that they have to put their hands up if they want to say something.
She thinks it's a stupid rule that they are not allowed to use swearwords.

Lösung/Lösungsvorschlag

- a) *Hannah doesn't like her school uniform but Joel likes his school uniform.*
b) *Will thinks his school uniform is OK.*
His school uniform is a green sweatshirt, a dark green blazer, black trousers and black shoes.
c) *Seventeen students are against school uniforms. Only eight students are for school uniforms.*
